RABBI HERMAN E. SCHAAALMAN INTERRELIGIOUS LEADERSHIP AWARD



Students are invited to offer a two-part paper identifying a specific issue or gap within a particular context that could be addressed through an interreligious event/ initiative and setting forth a plan for implementing that event/initiative. One winner will be selected and will receive a \$500 honorarium plus an additional \$500 micro grant to enact their event/initiative.

The winner will be invited to present their paper at a community event the week of November 27, 2017. This event will be held at Chicago Theological Seminary if the winner is a Chicago-based student and in the winner's community if the recipient is an online student based elsewhere.

The winner will be announced November 3, 2017.

RABBI HERMAN E. SCHAAALMAN INTERRELIGIOUS LEADERSHIP AWARD

Your submission should be offered in two parts:

Part I:

A sermon, blog, or essay (800 – 1600 words) that points to the need for an event/project/initiative that advances interreligious understanding, engagement, and leadership.

Part II:

An outline of a plan for your specific event/project. The plan should identify the event/initiative, context, audience/participants, goals, timeline, and assessment plan.

Your piece must include a concrete proposal for a specific interreligious event that you would like to implement, identifying a particular issue you wish to address within a specific context or community. Your event should be able to be enacted by August of 2018 and must be funded by the \$500 micro grant. If your event involves additional funds beyond the micro grant, you must include an accounting for how you plan to raise the additional funds.

Eligibility: Students in good standing, currently enrolled in a Masters' or Doctoral level degree program (face-to-face or online) at Chicago Theological Seminary, may participate. Award recipients will be required to provide documentation of micro grant use through the submission of receipts for expenses and a brief summary report.

Maximum of 1 submission per student.

Due to the Dean's office via email no later than Friday, October 27, 2017 at 5:00 pm.

The winner will be announced November 3, 2017.
