Novelist and essayist, Marilynne Robinson received the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction in 2005, the 2012 National Humanities Medal, and the 2016 Library of Congress Prize for American Fiction. The topics of her essays include the relationship between religion and science, nuclear pollution, John Calvin, and contemporary American politics.
