BRIEF HISTORY

The seed for Our Hope was planted at an Atlanta MCC Bible Study in 1999. The first meeting was held in the Athens's home of Tommie Black and Patty Compton. The first service was held in August 1999 at the Holiday Inn in Downtown Athens. For the next 16 years Our Hope rented various spaces for the Sunday Services. In August of 2016 Our Hope moved into a more permanent 24/7 space on Tracy Street in Athens. In this space we are able to have functions during the week as well as Sunday Services. The founding Pastor served for nearly 17 years before moving on.

OUR COMMUNITY

Athens, Georgia, is a gay-friendly city. Of the 25 U.S. metro areas with the highest percentage of gay and lesbian households, two are in Georgia. Athens is one and Atlanta is the other. According to an article in Advocate magazine, which caters to the LGBTQ community, Atlanta is the "gayest" city in America. And Atlanta is very close to Athens (only 1½ hours away) so night life, as well as cultural activities in Atlanta, can be considered a benefit of living in Athens.

Athens is the home of the University of Georgia. UGA fosters an open-minded, tolerant population, as does the edgy arts, theater, and live-music scene, which has cultivated such queer-relevant musical acts as the B-52s, the Indigo Girls, Wide Spread Panic, Drive By Truckers and R.E.M. (out rocker Michael Stipe resides in Athens). The 313 acre State Botanical Gardens of Georgia is located in Athens - it was set aside by UGA in 1968 for the study and enjoyment of plants and nature. It contains a number of specialized theme gardens and collections, more than five miles of nature trails, and four major facilities including a tropical conservatory. The Georgia Museum of Art at UGA has been, since 1982, the official state art museum.

There are many LGBTQ resources in Athens and Our Hope MCC is included in a list of these resources (https://www.athenspride.org/lgbtq-resources/).

There are numerous restaurants and cultural activities available throughout Athens. All of the information about Athens can be found on multiple web pages if you do a Google Search for Athens, Georgia. You can narrow down your search to particular areas of interest by including other terms in your search.

PASTORAL EXPECTATIONS

Our Hope MCC seeks a Pastor who will be a teacher, preacher and spiritual leader of the congregation. Regular hours of availability to the congregations members is very important so that we can get to know our new Pastor and he/she can get to know us. S/he will be a leader for the Our Hope MCC Council and a strong component of our Outreach Programs to UGA Students and the community.

WORSHIP AND OUTREACH

Our Hope MCC seeks to offer the Love of GOD to Everyone with A Special Focus on The LGBT Community. We are committed to applied spirituality that focuses on Loving GOD, Loving Our Neighbors as We Love Ourselves, and Treating others the same way we would like to be treated.

There are Lay Minsters at Our Hope to provide prayer in the times of need in a person's life to help them keep their faith intact as well as provide possible ways to assist them.

We have an Angel Patrol team at Our Hope that goes out and delivers food and clothing to the homeless during the winter months.

The Hunger Bowl is a special event in Athens. Annually as many as 100 teams across North East Georgia compete against each other to raise money and food to raise awareness to fight against hunger. We have won twice.

Athens Pride is held in Athens every year. This year it is the 2nd weekend in September Our Hope has a booth at the event to reach out to the community.

Our Hope is also a sponsor of Boybutante AIDS Foundation. This group has many events, including BINGO, dances, brunch, drag shows and the Boybutante Ball, that the members of Our Hope participate in.

Our Hope in the past has worked with and been part of the Campus Christian Ministries, worked with the Presbyterian and Episcopal Student Centers at the University of Georgia.

FINANCES

The finances over the years have been remarkable for the size of our community. Currently while we are waiting for a new Pastor the finances of the church are not at the norm. The attendance also needs improvement. Our Hope MCC has more than enough in its accounts to cover 1 year of Pastors salary and the church expenses. We believe this will give the incoming Pastor the opportunity to succeed from a financial prospective.
