


Educational Effectiveness and Student Achievement



Years to Completion: Graduating MDiv Students





Graduating Students' Satisfaction with their Program: Ministry Skills, MDiv Students





Graduating Students' Satisfaction with Program: Ministry Skills, Other Degree Programs





Graduating Students' Measure of Personal Growth: All Programs









Graduating Students' Overall Experience During Program: All Students






PhD Alums in 2022




PhD Alums in 2010



PhD Alums in 2014




PhD Alums in 2018




Placement Rates – All MDiv Graduates One Year After Graduation







Incoming Students who have Withdrawn

- The number of students who have withdrawn is thus far the lowest it's been in three years. This is a testament to the fact that though students are going through challenging times and taking leaves, they are committed to returning to their studies.

- 0.2% withdrew in Fall 2022
- 2% withdrew in 2021
- 2% withdrew in 2020
- 4% withdrew in 2019
- 3% withdrew in 2018




Students Taking a Leave of Absence

- 2) Personal and family challenges related to health


In 2022 the numbers look to be returning to normal; however, enrollment is low.

Students Withdrawn since 2019


The number of students withdrawing from CTS averages around 16 students per year.




Number of Graduates

We also had several part-time students who began in 2018 matriculate through the system.




Retention/Completion: MDiv students who began in 2017 36% will graduate by 2022 – 55 students total



0% Graduated in 3 years; 16% Graduated in 4 years; 20% will graduate in 5 years; 5% withdrew; 24% inactive; 35% still enrolled

Retention/Completion: MA students who began in 2018 60% will graduate by 2022 – 10 students total



10% Graduated in 2 years; 50% Graduated in 3 Years; 10% Graduated in 4 Years; 20% still Enrolled; 10% Inactive; 0% withdrew
