Kamilah Hall Sharp is a native of St. Louis, Missouri. She most recently resided in DeSoto, Texas, with her husband Nakia and daughter Anaya. After practicing law for ten years, she accepted her call to ministry to preach, teach, and engage in social activism in the streets. Her scholarship focuses on the intersection of race, gender,

and class within biblical texts and contemporary culture, womanist leadership, and community building.

Dr. Hall Sharp is a co-author of The Gathering, A Womanist Church: Origins, Stories, Sermons, and Litanies; and a contributor to Bitter the Chastening Rod: Africana Biblical Interpretation after Stony the Road We Trod in the Age of BLM, #SayHerName, and #MeToo and Slavery's Long Shadow: Race and Reconciliation in American Christianity. Additionally, she is an ordained minister in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). She currently serves as co-pastor of The Gathering, A Womanist Church in Dallas, Texas; an interfaith member of the clergy advisory board for Faith in Action; and a Girl Scout Troop Leader. Dr. Hall Sharp holds a B.S in Business Economics from Florida A&M University, an M.Div. from Memphis Theological Seminary, a J.D. from Indiana University-Bloomington, and a Ph.D. in Biblical Interpretation - Hebrew Bible from Brite Divinity School at Texas Christian University.
