ABOUT THE SPEAKER



Zachary Moon was born in Oakland California and raised in the Religious Society of Friends (Quakers). At age 23, he was called to preach by Faith Community Church in Greensboro North Carolina. He is a graduate of Vassar College (BA, 2004), Chicago Theological Seminary (MDiv 2010), and Iliff School of Theology (Ph.D.

2016). He has served on the full-time teaching faculty of Chicago Theological Seminary since 2016, now as Professor of Theology and Psychology. He has published widely, including four books: Coming Home: Ministry That Matters with Veterans and Military Families (Chalice Press, 2015), Warriors between Worlds: Moral Injury and Identities in Crisis (Lexington Books, 2019), Goatwalking: A Quaker Pastoral Theology (Brill, 2021), and Doing Theology in Pandemics: Facing Viruses, Violence, and Vitriol (Pickwick, 2022). Prior to his academic work, he served as a chaplain in multiple contexts with specialization in working with military personnel, veterans, and military families impacted by trauma and moral injury. Outside of the academic sphere, you will find Zachary coaching youth soccer on the Southside of Chicago.
